# **Graduation Requirements**

- Have completed 20 credits
- Completed all compulsory courses which include:
  - 3 English
  - Physical Education 401
  - CEO 401
  - 2 Science
  - 2 Social Studies (one must be Canadian Content)
  - 2 Math
  - 1 credit identified as a creative or innovative credit
  - 5 Credits at the Grade 12 level (600 or 800)

# **TOSH Honours Requirements**

To be recognized as a PSB honours graduate, a student must:

- Successfully complete the Provincial Graduation Requirements
- Achieve an aggregate of 480 in (6) grade 12 courses (600 & 800 level), one of which is English, and no mark lower than 70% in the 6 Grade 12 courses included in the aggregate calculation.

To obtain Honours at Three Oaks for Grade 10 or Grade 11, a student must take 8 courses from Three Oaks during each of the respective years, the average of all eight (8) courses must be a minimum of 80% and must have no mark less than 70%.

### What is the difference between College & University?

# Colleges

Tend to be more directly career-oriented. Although program length varies, a certificate program is generally one year or less & a diploma program can be two or three years. Offer pre-trades & apprenticeship training, language training, and skills upgrading. **Certain college programs can be more challenging to be admitted into than university.** 

# Universities

Are degree-granting educational institutions. All offer undergraduate, or bachelor's degrees, and many offer graduate (Master's and Doctoral programs). Offer professional programs such as Medicine, Dentistry, and Law. Students, if accepted, begin these after at least 2 or 3 years of undergraduate study.

### What is the difference between College & University?

#### College

Students mostly reside off campus In class time typically Monday to Friday all day 1 - 2 years of courses Graduate with diploma or certificate Typically smaller classes Instructors teach courses Hands on Learning with theory as required Many on campus activities

#### University

Students reside on & off campus In class time varies from day to day 4 plus years of courses Graduate with a degree Typically larger classes Professors teach courses Theory Based Learning Many on campus activities

# University Requirements

- A minimum of 5 621 credits based on program of choice.
- Must have English 621A (or 611X)
- Minimum of 70-90% average- depending on the university and the program, as some are very competitive.

Each university accepts different courses – the courses that MAY NOT BE accepted depending on the program of choice are as follows:

- PED621A
- DRA621A
- MUS621A
- FAM621A
- ART621A
- MUS621K

# Math & Science Requirements

- Math 621A is strongly recommended for a B.A.
- Two 621A Science credits for a B.Sc
  - It is highly recommended that one be Chemistry and the other Physics or Biology depending on the program.
- Math 621B may be required for a B.Sc and highly recommended for a B.B.A
- Math 611B is highly recommended for B.Sc
- If attending UPEI, you will have to pass a math pre-test to get into their Science Degree Program.

# Bachelor of Arts Requirements:

- English 621A
- One Social Studies or language
- Any 3 other academic courses
- MAT621A is recommended but not required.
- Note: MAT621A is a prerequisite for some first year Arts courses

# Bachelor of Science Requirements:

- English 621A
- Mathematics 621A, 621B or 611B (note that most will require students to take CALCULUS)
- Two Science Courses at the 621 level
- One other Academic Course

# Bachelor of Nursing Requirements

- Applicants must have completed a grade 12 Academic program with a minimum average of 70% and no marks in English, Math, Chemistry and Biology of less than 65%.Typically applicants must have a 90% + average due to limited enrolment (dependent on the school). Most require completion of Casper test
- Must complete:

English 621A Math 621A, 621B, or 611B Chemistry 621A Biology 621 Plus one more 621 credit

# **Bachelor of Business Requirements**


- English 621A
- Math 621A or 611B
- Any 2 social studies, languages or sciences
- One other Academic course
- Economics 621 is strongly recommended
- Accounting 621 is also a good idea

# Bachelor of Science in Engineering (UNB) Requirements

- All marks in courses must be above 70% and no marks less than 65%.
  Minimum admission average is 75%
- English 621A
- Math 621A (maybe), MAT621B, Math 611B
- Chemistry 621A
- Physics 621A
- 1 Specified Elective
- NOTE: Each University has their own requirements

### Bachelor of Health Sciences Dalhousie University

- Completion of an Academic grade 12 program with at least five 621 courses including:
  - English 621A
  - Math 621A, MAT621B or Math 611B. NOTE: They will likely take CALCULUS.
  - Two 621 science courses. The choice of the science courses will vary depending on which of the health science professions you are applying to.



# College Requirements

- Minimum of ENG671C (Note that ENG671A meets graduation requirements BUT likely not admission requirements to many college programs – Ex. Holland College)
- ENG621A is preferred
- Program requirements vary GREATLY.

- Each program will have its own requirements for entrance. In some cases the programs may be competitive entry and in other cases it may be first come first serve.
  - APPLY EARLY
  - Ensure you meet (or exceed) the entrance requirements.
  - You can also talk with a recruiter or people in admissions at the colleges to see how to best add to your application (work experience, upgrade courses, certifications, etc)

Program minimum requirements are 70% in each required course.

#### Welding Fabrication

- Students accepted with general or academic marks, but preference is given to academic credits.
- Majority of students had academic math, and English.
- Many of the students had physics.
- All of students had trades related courses such as Intro to Welding, Oxyfuel processes, Gas Metal Arc, Automotive, Woodworking and Carpentry.

### Articulation Agreements Between Colleges & Universities

•Many colleges have agreements in place with universities where once a student finishes a diploma program, they are able to apply to a university and continue their education to obtain a degree. Eg. Journalism Program

•The student must still meet the pre-requisite requirements from the university.

•Finishing the diploma program at college does not guarantee acceptance to the university program.

# Early Admission to University

- Limited enrollment program
- Program specific (ex. Engineering)
- Potentially 90%+
- This is my only school of choice.



# Post Secondary Application Process

#### When do I apply? When are deadlines?

- Holland College is usually end of February.
- UPEI School of Nursing is earlier than regular UPEI applications (February 15). Casper test required.
- Many Universities require early application for admissions if you want to be automatically considered for a scholarship.



# Post Secondary Application Process: How do I apply?

- Obtain application form from Post Secondary Institution Website.
- Complete all required information.
- Send completed form and required application fee to the Post Secondary.
- Fill out the transcript request form in Student Services OR on the Google Classroom and the transcript will be sent for you.

- Some Universities & Colleges require the student to upload their transcript to their student dashboard (ex. Holland College). For this request a PDF version of your transcript to be emailed to you.

# **Community Service Bursary**

This is a program through the P.E.I. Government (NOT TOSH)

Grade 10, 11 or 12 and planning to attend any post-secondary institution can accumulate volunteer hours from the completion of Grade 9 (July 1) until June 30 of your Grade 12 year (all documents submitted by July 31).

Complete 30-150 hours and receive a bursary valued at \$10/hr

(30 hrs = \$300 and 150 hrs = \$1,500).

Volunteer at an organization in PEI that is registered with the Community Services program.

You may place your bursary on hold for one academic year.

# **Community Service Bursary**

- STEP 1: Find an organization
- STEP 2: Fill in the online registration form (you will need your Social Insurance Number)
- STEP 3: Each organization you volunteer with will need to submit hours for you using the *online* form.
- STEP 4: Fill in and submit the Student Information sheet (online). This form tells the Government where to send the money (it goes into your post secondary school account in November).

# Notes to Self

- Choose your courses wisely (Read the course outline book thoroughly)
- Create a course choice plan for graduation (Think ahead)
- Ask questions about courses from teachers and other students
- Registration forms due to HR teacher by end of March.
- Must be passing a pre-requisite course at progress report time in order to maintain registration in the next year's course
